The 2nd Project meeting was organized in Ozel Trakya Koleji in Çorlu on 31^{st} May - 5^{th} June, 2009 Coordinators, principals and teachers from Austria, Germany, Lithuania, Poland, Sweden, Slovenia and the United Kingdom joined their Turkish friends and together they present this year work and explored some of beautiful Turkey. At the beginning of the first day we have a guide tour around the school complex. Than the students of each country had a 10 minutes presentation about their school (presentations are on the web).

The pupils learned that Istabnul historically also known as Byzantium and Constantinopleis the largest city in Turkey and fifth largest city proper in the world with a population of 12.6 million. Istanbul is also a megacity, as well as the cultural and financial centre of Turkey. The city covers 39 districts of the Istanbul province. It is located on the Bosphorus Strait and encompasses the natural harbour known as the Golden Horn, in the northwest of the country. It extends both on the European (Thrace) and on the Asian (Anatolia) sides of the Bosphorus, and is thereby the only metropolis in the world that is situated on two continents. In its long history, Istanbul has served as the capital city of the Roman Empire (330–395), the East Roman (Byzantine) Empire (395–1204 and 1261–1453), the Latin Empire (1204–1261), and the Ottoman Empire (1453–1922). The city was chosen as joint European Capital of





Culture for 2010. The historic areas of Istanbul were added to the UNESCO World Heritage List in 1985.

We taken a tour guide to the city and then we had a trip with boat.

Last day in Ozel Trakya Koleji in Çorlu we had evaluation of pour first year work. We all agree that we work good and serious. All pupils and teachers done a great job and we all highly satisfied with cooperation between al partners. At the end we were talking about our next meeting in Krems in Austria.
