

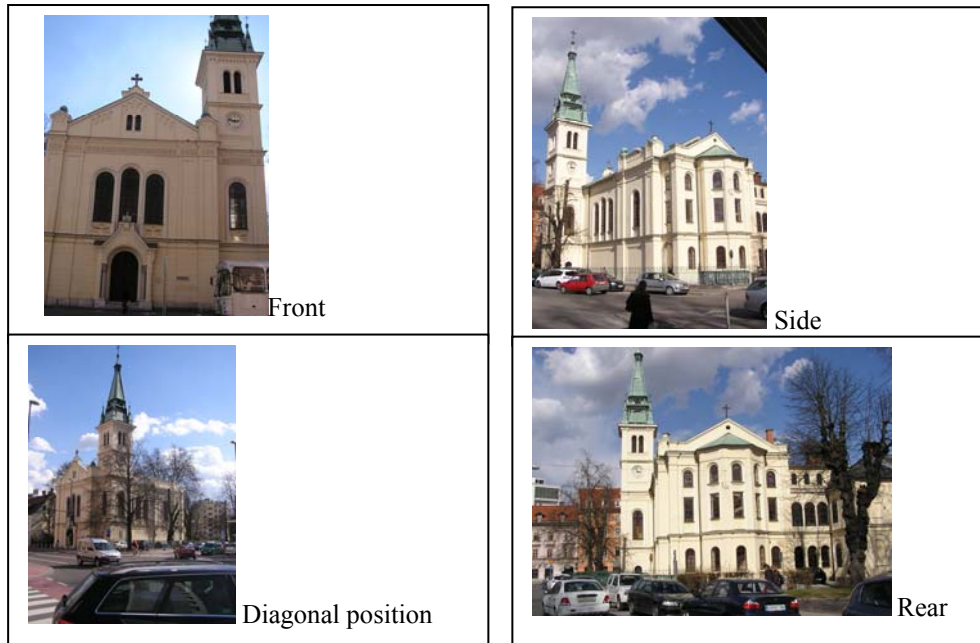

## Church of Primož Trubar in Ljubljana

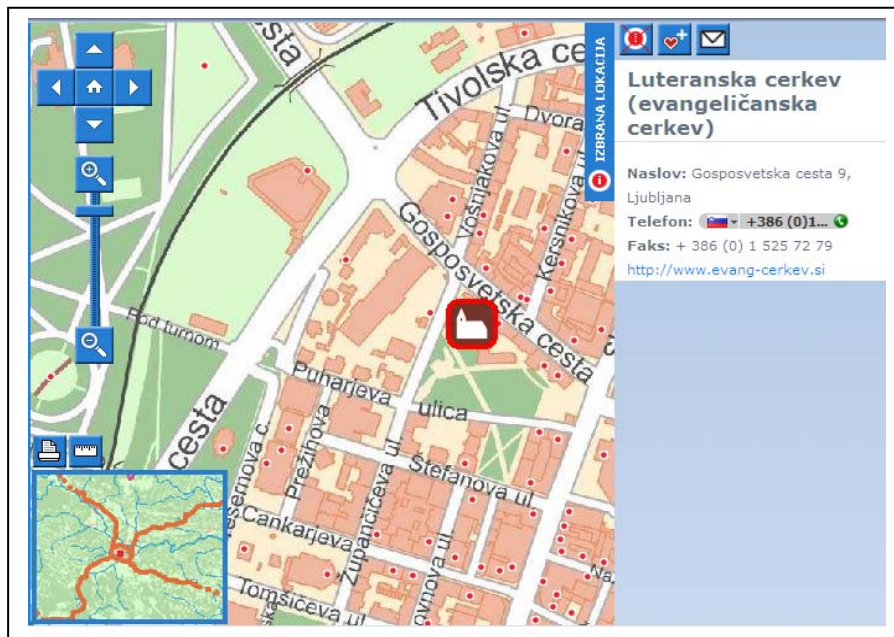

Description

Description: In Slovenia there are 13 Evangelical churches. Among these we can find the Church of Primož Trubar in Ljubljana. This church covers  $\frac{3}{4}$  of the Slovene region where 300 believers live. Altogether there are 18,000 protestants in Slovenia. The church is very humble in decorations and it is built in the New Roman style. The evangelical priests don't have celibacy and they don't praise Mary. The main stress is on New Testament. The service is led by women as well as men. There are four women priests in Slovenia.

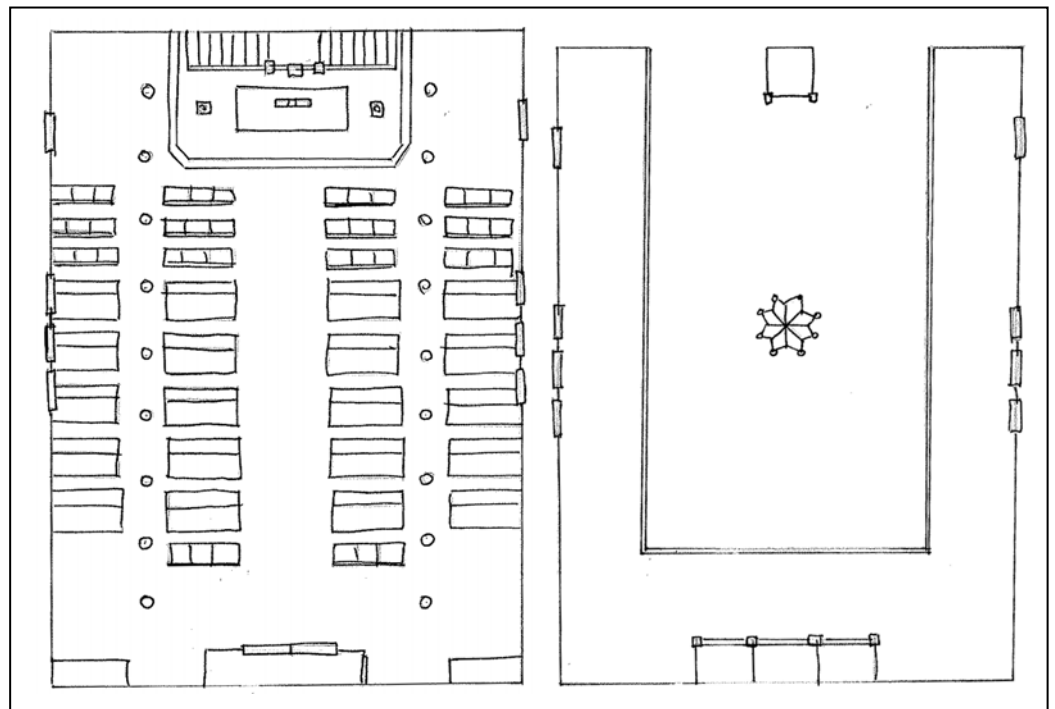

	<p>The altar painting Jesus meets the Samaritan woman</p>	<p>The author: an Austrian Kunnel 1852</p>
	<p>Altar</p>	<p>The former altar with the pulpit was removed in 1945. The present altar, which Plečnik's followers made, was set in 1953. There is the Holy Bible on the altar – the symbol of the God's words – the cross, candles and flowers – which symbolizes sacrifice. There are no side altars.</p>
	<p>The organ</p>	<p>The organ dates in year 1888 and is made by Jože Goršič.</p>
	<p>Inside church</p>	<p>The main nave is surrounded by a wooden choir. The benches were brought from the Ljubljana town house.</p>
		<p>The wooden altar basement dates from 1851. The wooden details were handmade.</p>

	<p>The ceiling</p>	<p>The acoustics in the church is perfect due to the wooden ceiling.</p>

		<p>PRIMOŽ TRUBAR was a Slovene protestant reformer, the founder and the first superintendent of the Protestant Church of the Slovene Lands, a consolidator of the Slovene language and the author of the first Slovene printed book.</p>
